


Karl Reester 2010 Outstanding Bowler




Karl was elected to the Syracuse Bowling Association Hall of Fame in the Outstanding Bowler category. He has been bowling in Syracuse since the 1970's. Karl has several outstanding accomplishments to his credits including twelve 300 games, nineteen 299 games, six 298 games, one 800 series of 855 and

many 700 series. He has been on several league championship teams and has a high average of 223. Karl has participated in many local, state and national tournaments with some outstanding achievements. These include winning the New York State Senior Tournament All-Events in 2004 with a score of 1364. In the 1994-95 season, he won two Classic Bowlers Association Seniors Division tournaments. Karl placed sixth in the Seniors Regular Singles of the Bowlers Journal in 2001. In the Seniors National Tournament in Reno, Nevada in 2004, Karl place fourth. In 2006, Karl won two New York State Senior Tournament All-Event titles; they were the 60-64 yr old division with a score of 1412 and the 65-69 yr old division with a score of 1355. Karl is also league secretary for some local leagues and has served on the SBA board as director, 2nd Vice President and as a director of the newly formed Central New York USBC Association.

Gene Young 2010 Meritorious Service (no pic)

Gene was an excellent statistician with very good organizing skills. In 1925, when Syracuse changed their bowling affiliation from the Atlantic Coast Bowling Association to the American Bowling Congress, Gene was voted to be the first secretary of the ABC affiliated Syracuse Bowling Association. He held that position for three years. In 1928, when the Herald wanted to run a bowling tournament, they asked Gene to manage it for them. The tournament was called "The Herald Diamond Medal Tournament" and was very popular for many years. In it's first year, it drew in a total of 904 bowlers. Gene had a reputation of getting everything running smoothly and on time. In 1936, he became the very first Syracusan to work on the Executive Staff of the American Bowling Congress. He would go on to serve in the official clerical capacity during the ABC tournament held in Indianapolis, Indiana

Gary Kelly 2010 Outstanding Bowler



Gary has been bowling in the men's leagues in Syracuse since 1963. He has done as much with his bowling abilities as with his meritorious service to the bowling community. Gary was in partnership with Joe Creno in the Creno & Kelly Pro Shop for several years. Then he ventured

out and co-owned the Bowling & Trophy Center with Dom Cefalo. Gary finally went into business for himself owning a Pro Sports & Awards Shop. Besides helping others with their bowling equipment, he made time to write a column for the Striking News bowling paper. Some of Gary's bowling accomplishments include, being on many championship teams which included the City League and the Post Standard Classic League. In 1971, he averages of 257 for six games to lead the nation in the Brunswick Automatic Scorers Tournament, in that same year, Gary set a national record for the most consecutive 200 or better games, bowling forty -six 200 or better games in a row a record that would stand for over twenty years. In 1972, he won the local ABC Masters Qualifying Tournament. In 1977, Gary finished third in the Herold Masters Tournament and in 1978, a member of the Professional Bowlers Association; he finished eleventh place in Syracuse Miller Lite Open. Gary's high league average was 218 in 1972.

Robert Gray 2011 Outstanding Veteran



Bob has bowled in the SBA for over 37 years. He has won the NYS bowling championship 15+ under division in 1973. Bob won the Valley City News Master (Oswego City) in 1977 and for two years led the Post Standard Master qualifying. In 1985, he paired up with Buddy

Amidon to win the Van Wie Doubles and the were third in 1987 and 2002. His highest league average was 222 in 2003 with a composite average of 204. Bob has rolled eight 300 games, one 299 game, one 298 game, and four 800 series with the highest of 858 in 2003. Bob has served as a director of the SBA and has been on several league championship teams.


Edward M. Batruch 2011 Outstanding Bowler



Ed has participated in the SBA for over 29 years. He has seventeen 300 games, five 299 games, one 298 game, five 800 series, the highest one being an 859 in 2003, when he started with the first thirty-one strikes. He was the US Open match play champion in 1992 and finished third in the Post

Standard Masters in 1993. Ed has been on over 20 league championship teams, including 1987-1988 City League champion (Saliba's Pro Shop) and 2000-2001 GSL overall champion (Lighthouse Lanes). While teaming up with Dave Maxsween he won back-to-back Van Wie Doubles titles in 2001 and 2002. Ed has competed in twenty-two USBC National Tournaments with a composite average of 192, and twenty-three State Tournaments with a 300 game in the 2003 NYS team event. He has over four hundred 700 series, with his league highest average of 229 in 2004 and a lifetime composite league average of 211.


Joseph Losurdo 2011 Outstanding Bowler



While participating in the SBA for 24 years, Joe earned high league average five times, the highest being 229 in the Post Standard Classic in 1987 and 1988. He has bowled in twenty UABC National Tournaments, finishing 4th in team event in 2003 and 20th in 2010 with a composite average of 204.

Joe has bowled in twenty state tournaments, he finished 1st in the team event in 1989 and in 1994, when he shot one of his 300 games. While bowling in the state tournament in 2004, he shot 300 and 800 in the doubles event and in the 2006 doubles event he shot an 800 series. Joe has been on three teams, that have won the SBA tournament in 1986, 1987 and 2002. The SBA doubles title in 1987 and 1988 with Sam Ventura and the SBA singles title in 1987. Joe has won the Van Wie Doubles three times, in 1988 with Mike Tryniski and in 1996 and 1998 with Bob Hoefler. He won the Syracuse Herald Masters in 1991 and has been a member of the PBA for 12 years with two second place regional finishes. He has to his credit twenty-eight 300 games, eight 299 games, two 298 games fourteen 800 series. Joe coached the Oswego High School bowling team from 1988 – 1992.


Robert Hoefler 2012 Outstanding Bowler



While participating in the SBA for 22 years, Bob earned numerous high average and league championship awards. He has bowled in sixteen USBC national tournaments, thirteen SBA city tournaments and twelve NYS tournaments. While bowling on the National Cleanway

team he won the SBC city league title from 1993-1998, they recorded the SBA high team series record of 3763 in 1995 which still stands today. In 1994, Bob bowling in the USBC national tournament they took first place in the team all event category, in 1997, seventh place in the team event and fortieth place in 1996 and 2004. Bob won back-to-back Post Standard Master titles in 1996 and 1997. In 1996 and 1998, he paired up with Joe Losurdo to win the Van Wie Doubles. Bob rolled a 856 series in 1994, which was an Oswego Bowling Association record and in 1997 bowled it again for a SBA record for that year. He has achieved three 298 games, six 299 games, twenty-three 300 games and fifteen 800 series. Bob rolled back-to-back 300's on his way to a 829 series in the Syracuse City League competition in 1993. He was inducted in the Oswego Bowling Hall of Fame in 2001. Bob has been the coach for the boys/girls Oswego High School Bowling team since 2009.

Robert Medico 2012 Meritorious Service



Bob served in the Syracuse Bowling Association for 14 years, from 1993-2002, he was a director serving on sixty-four committees and was chairman of 19. With his extensive knowledge of the Roberts Rules of Order, he was called on several times over the

years to interpret them when needed. From 2003-2006, Bob served as Vice President and in 2006 became President of the association. At that time, he had the dubious task of starting the process of getting the SBA back on its feet after some trying times. This could not have been done without his leadership and devotion of so much of his time and efforts.


Samual W. Soj dak 2012 Outstanding Veteran



Sam bowled in sanctioned leagues in the Syracuse area from 1963 until his untimely death in 1991. He had a number of 700 series and averaged 200 or more for six consecutive years from 1983 to 1989 with his highest average of 209 came in the Syracuse City League in 1988-89 season. Sam finished in

first place in the SBA Champion of Champion tournament in 1987 with 696 and also had a 299 game in the Post Standard Classic league that year. His accuracy, consistency and effortless motion was the reasons for his success in the era of rubber bowling balls, wooden lanes and oiled lane conditions not all conducive to high scores. Sam was a fixture for several years on the Red Snapper Restaurant team and was referred to by his fellow bowlers as very consistent in a difficult match in any competitive situation.

Michael Tryniski 2013 Outstanding Bowler



Mike has participated in the SBA for 29 years, during that time frame, he has earned numerous high averages in Syracuse and Fulton Associations. He has participated in twenty-six USBC National Tournaments, finishing first in doubles event in 1994. Mike has also bowled in 34 NYS tournaments

finishing 1st in the team all events in 1997. He has had one hundred plus 300 games, one of which was in the USBC Nationals and two in the Bowlers Journal Tournament. Mike has had thirty-two 800 series highest being 833 and one of them also was bowled in the Bowler Journal Tournament. Across the country he has won seven PBA Regional titles and in 2000 was PBA player of the year and was on the PBA TV show from Vegas. Mike has spent his time coaching the boys/girls Fulton High School bowling teams for the past 5 years. During that time period the boys team won two Section 3 titles and the girls won one Section 3 titles. While bowling in thirty-two State Tournaments, Mike has finished 1st three times in the Team All-Event Category.

Charles Trudell 2013 Meritorious Service



Chuck served on the SBA for thirteen years, he served as Vice President from 2000 through 2004 and President in the 2004 -2005 season. During his tenure, he served on forty committees and was appointed to be chairman of twenty-four of them. Chuck was a member

of the YABC board of directors and was the chairman for that committee for six years. He spent a lot of his time tending to the affairs of the youth bowlers in Syracuse and was the bowling coach of the Solvay Junior Travel Team. Because of his devotion to the youth, Chuck was honored with the SYABA Distinguished Service to Youth Award in 2007.

Michael Cefalo 2013 Outstanding Veteran



Mike has been a member of the SBA for 52 years. He has been on seven championship teams in three different leagues, plus while bowling in the GLS, he has been on the overall championship team in 1987,1983,1990 and 2008. Mike's highest average was 218 in 2009, he has five

300 games and three 800 series. Bowling with his brother Dominick, they won the Senior Van Wie Doubles in 2005 and State Senior Doubles in 2009 and 2010. Mike has participated in thirty-two USBC National Tournaments with his overall average of 191, in the same years 2004 and 2010 he won the Senior Singles title in both the State and Syracuse Tournament.


Daniel Smith 2014 Outstanding Bowler



Dan has been bowling in the Syracuse Association for over 25 years. He has rolled two 298 games, ten 299 games, thirty-one 300 games and seventeen 800 series. He has bowled in twelve ABC National Tournaments, with his best finish in the team event in 2002 being 27th place. In 2000,

at the tournament in Albuquerque, New Mexico is when he shot one of his 300 games. Dan has also bowled in ten State Tournaments. In 2002, he finished first in the all-events and first in the doubles event with his partner Cliff Saliba, this was also the year he shot 814 in route to these two titles. In 1999 Dan shot a 300 game in the PBA qualifier tournament and was the high roller sweeper winner. Locally his highest average was 229 in 1996 in the expressway classic league, in 2001 and 2003 he shot 794 series and in 2000 shot an 808 series in the Ken Whiting Memorial League. Dan has opened several pro shops in the Syracuse area and was National sales manager for Storm/Rotogrip for six years.


Doug Gustin 2014 Meritorious service



Doug has served on the Syracuse Bowling Association's Board of Directors for 16 years, while on the board he served on fifty-four different committees. He was so well respected that he either served as chairman or co-chairman of twenty-one of those committees. For two years, Doug

was chosen to be a delegate to the National ABC convention to represent Syracuse. This is also when he 1999 ABC national tournament was awarded to Syracuse. He served on the Associations' local planning committee from 1995 until 1999. Doug served as Vice President for the 1997/98 & 1998/99 bowling seasons, then was elected President for the 1999-2000 season. His commitment and leadership to bowling in the Syracuse area had a great impact on our sport.

Rod Collins 2014 Outstanding Veteran



Rod grew up around the sport of bowling. His Father's a member of the Syracuse Bowling Association Hall of Fame. The Collins family was very prominent bowling family in Central New York. Along with his father Don, he has two Uncle's Kit and Gabby along

with his cousin Ken. Rod was an excellent junior bowler, winning the Pepsi Junior Masters championship as well as the Central New York Scholastic Holiday Bowling Tournament. When Rod started bowling in men's leagues, he made quite an impact. He bowled on championship teams and in 1985 he was a member of the City League champions. During the 1970's, 1980's and early 1990's he carried over a 200 average in several leagues with his highest average being 216 in the 1989-1990 season. His accomplishments include a 298 game in 1984, two 300 games bowled in 1981 and 1988. In 1978, he was Syracuse Bowling Association's singles champion with a score of 709. Three times Rod was on the winning duo of the VanWie Doubles Tournament in 1978 with his brother Gabby and in 1983 and 1984 with his father Don. Rod was runner up in the 1986 Herald Masters Tournament.

Richard L. Spasato 2015 Outstanding Bowler



Richie has been bowling in the SBA for 35 years, during that period he has rolled one-298 game, five - 299 games, thirty-one 300 games, six- 800 series and over two hundred-fifty 700 series. His highest league average was a 232 and has averaged over 220 in leagues numerous times. He has bowled

in ten ABC tournaments with his best finish 2nd in Team Event in 2005 and ten State Tournaments finishing 10th in 2006. While bowling in numerous local tournaments, Richie finished 1st in Champion of Champions, Bud Bowl and City Singles twice. Richie has two PBA regional titles, two singles titles in tournaments in Holland. He finished second in the Harold Masters in 1985 and 2nd in the Van Wie Doubles with Lou Scrimale. Richie is the founder and owner of Lane #1 Bowling for over 20 years and has been the main sponsor of the Post Standard Masters TV show.

Brian Langdon 2015 meritorious Services



Brian has participated in the SBA for 39 years and has bowled in thirty-nine ABC National Championship Tournaments. During his time on the SBA Board of Directors he served as a director and President during the 1990-1991 season. Brian became an honorary Life Member. He is

presently serving as the secretary/treasurer of the Sackett Tract league at Pastimes AC, which is currently one of the oldest leagues in Syracuse. Brian is only the second secretary in that leagues history and he has been doing that for thirty years.

Ray Bresee 2015 Meritorious Service



Ray was posthumously elected to the class of 2015 SBA. Although his 10 year service on the board of director from 2000 until 2010 was way too short, he made a tremendous impact to the bowling community. Ray served on twenty-seven committees for the SBA in which he made an impact on them.

The most important one being the Chairman of the Hall of Fame committee. While under his leadership, the selection process was revised and is a ver smooth and professional process. While Ray was bowling, he accomplished every bowlers dream by bowling a perfect 300 game.

Joe Cardone 2015 Outstanding Veteran



Joe began his bowling career in 1946, a proud member of our association spanning 69 years. During this time, he bowled in the GSL for 51 years and has been part of many championship teams. Joe has a high game of 290 and high series of 775, back in the day of hard rubber balls when those scores were very

few. He has bowled in the ABC tournaments in Syracuse in 1972, 1999 and in 2008 at the age of 86, he rolled a 710 series. Throughout his career, Joe has held many offices in the leagues he as bowled in, such as secretary for the GSL and 20 years as the secretary for Salt City League at Erie Lanes. In the 1940's, Joe bowled in leagues at Jefferson Bowling Academy on Jefferson Street where there were 20 lanes upstairs and 20 lanes downstairs consisting of 80 5 man teams, the league was called The Commercial League.


David Silvernail 2015 Outstanding Veteran



Dave has a long and outstanding fifty-year bowling career in the SBA, which spanned five decades, from the 1960's - 2000's. During this period, he has he is only one of two individuals to bowl sanctioned award scores in the SBA, in each decade, with Art


Cornelious being the other. In his career, Dave has had thre 299 games, five 300 games and an 800 series. While bowling on the Syracuse Bowlers Pro Shop team he was the Syracuse Association Champion in 1975 and also won the Herald Master Tournament that year. He was elected by the Classic League bowlers of Syracuse to the first team of the "World of Ten Pins All-Star team." In 1981, he was the SBA Singles Champion with a 753 and in 1999, Dave on the SBA Seniors Masters "A" division singles event.

Jeff Gordon 2016 Outstanding Bowler



Jeff has bowling in the SBA for over 20 years, during that period he has thirteen 300 games, five 299 games, four 298 games and four 800 series. Jeff also had numerous 700 series with his highest being 799 and two 798's. Jeff has bowled in twenty-three ABC/USBC National Tournaments, 1st place in 1994 with his National Cleanway Team in the Team Event and 4th place in the Doubles Event. In 1996 in the Team Event they finished 7th. Jeff has bowled in fifteen State Tournaments finishing 1st in 1991 and 2nd in 1992 in the Team Event. On the local level, he has competed in multiple tournaments, again finishing 1st in the Team Event with the National Cleanway Team in 1994, 1995 and 1996. Jeff has won the Doubles Event three times, one of which was a record score 1590 with partner Matt Chetney. Jeff has been a part of ten Post Standard League Championships, with the National Cleanway Team. He obtained his highest league average of 224 in the 2014-2015 season. While averaging 223 in 2013-2014 season. Jeff has also competed in the Win Shedding Doubles Championship and the Syracuse Bowls King of the Hill. Jeff has also been inducted into the Oswego Hall of Fame.

Carl Pawlick 2016 Meritorious Service



Carl has bowled in the SBA for over 40 years, starting at Expressway Lanes in 1975. He has seven 300 games, three 299 games, one 298 game, and a high series of 794, with his highest average 229 in the 2012-2013 season. In 1987, Carl became a certified

Y.A.B.A. instructor/coach at worked with the Saturday Morning Junior League at the Syracuse Bowling Center until it's closing. In 1996, he started the Monday Doubles league at Syracuse Bowling Center with just four team, with his hard work and dedication it is now 38 teams at Flamingo Bowl. Carl became a director of the SBA in 1997 and served on the board until 2007. During his time as director, he was on thirty-eight committees and served as chairperson on eleven of those. Carl served one-year terms as 4th vice president, 3rd vice president, and 2nd vice president of the SBA. Carl has been a well-respected secretary/treasurer of numerous bowling leagues throughout his career.

Vince DeFlorio 2016 Outstanding Veteran



Vince started bowling in 1961 and has many accomplishments in singles, double and team events. During this period of time he has rolled twenty 300 games, five 299 games, two 298 games and three 800 series. The highest being 845 in 2007. Vince also has numerous

700 series, with his highest being 797,793 and 790. Vince's highest average was 227 in 2007 bowling at Bowl Mor Lanes. His team accomplishments are three championships in the GSL with the Solvay Bank Team, four championships in the Ed Flavin Memorial League, with the DeFlorio Team, 1st place in the City Tournament with the Pat Capp Enterprise Team. Vince has bowled in three ABA/USBC National Tournaments and two State Tournaments. While bowling in Doubles Competition, he achieved 3rd place in the 1975 Van Wie Double with partner John DiFato, 1st place in the 1993 Solvay Doubles with partner Don Duzak Jr., 1st place in the 4th Annual Bowl Mor Christmas Doubles with partner Rosanne DeFlorio, 1st place in the 2000 Empire State Games with partner Robert Schaffler and 2nd in in the 2008 Senior Van Wie's with partner Chuck Richmond. In Singles Competition, Vince was Syracuse King of the Hill twice in 1975, 1st place in the 1991 Buffalo Bowl Inn Tournament, 1st place in the 2000 Senior States Tournament and 8th in the 2003 Harold Masters. In 2013, Vince received the GSL's Al Butler Sportsmanship Award.


Jack Cain 2017 Outstanding Veteran



Jack has bowled in the SBA for over 40 year, in that period he has to his credit; two 300 games, two 800 series, fifty-five 700 series with his highest being 790, three 299 games, and one 298 game. He has competed in 10 National Tournaments, 10 State Tournaments and in the City

Tournament his team, Sue'e Hair at Home won 1st place in 1989. In 1995 he finished 3rd in the Van Wie Doubles with partner Steve Kuss and in 2002 he won the Senior Van Wie's with partner Lou Scrimale. While bowling in the US Open qualifier in 1982, he finished 3rd. In 1991 in the Herald Master qualifier he shot the high game of 298. Jack's highest league average was 218 in the 2011-2012 season and has average at least 200 since 1970.

John Hough 2016 Outstanding Bowler



John bowled in the SBA for over 25 years, in that time he rolled forty-two 300 games, eight 299 games, and five 298 games along with that he rolled fourteen 800 series to his credit and over one hundred 700 series, the highest being 795. He has bowled in the ABC National Tournament sixteen times, with a lifetime average of 201. He was captain of the 1994 National

Cleanway team that finished first in the Team All-Event and which earned them an Eagle. The team also finished first in the SBA City tournament and John finished 1st in the Doubles Event with Jeff Gordon in 1994. John was a part of the National Cleanway team when they shot a record score of 3763 which stood for 16 years. With doubles partner Ed Batrich and Mike Daley, John has finished in the top five in the Van Wie Doubles several times, and in the 2015-2016 season he accomplished his highest final league average of 232.

Gary Vincitore 2016 Meritorious Service




Gary Mitchell Vincitore was the owner and general manager of the Lakeview Bowling Center in Liverpool for over 30 years. Prior to running Lakeview, he worked at Fremont Lanes in East Syracuse. He was a member of the SBA board of directors for 10 years. During that time Gary served on over twenty committees and was instrumental in planning

and building the Association offices that are back/under Lakeview Bowling Center. He was honored with the "Distinguished Service to Youth Award" and inducted into the Syracuse Youth Hall of Fame in 2009. Gary was a life member of the Liverpool Fire Department where he served as Chief, President and Line Officer for over thirty-seven years. Gary received several awards for his contribution to bowling, especially his efforts promoting youth bowling and charity events. Lakeview hosted many youth bowling tournaments with Gary waiving the lineage fee to enable the event to offer more scholarship money to the junior bowlers. Everyone who has had the pleasure of knowing Gary was touched by his huge heart.

Chuck Richmond 2018 Meritorious Service



Chuck has been a part of the SBA for over 35 years, during that time he has been secretary-treasurer of the Post Standard Classic League 1973-1979, Ken Whiting Memorial League 2000 to present, Graphic Four League 2008 to present, Bethman & Russell League 2007-2014. Chuck has

been an SBA director from 2002 -2017, while on the board he served more than thirty committees, chairman of the Nominating and Hall of Fame Committees, 201-2017. Chuck was voted Director of the Year in 2014 and 2016. He has twelve 300 games, two 800 series, and eight 299 games, with his highest league average of 224 in 2003. Chuck has bowled in twenty-three National Tournaments, ten State Tournaments, eighteen Local Tournaments finishing 1st in the City Tournament in 1998 All-Events scratch and handicap divisions. In the 2001-2002 season he was on the Lakeport Bait and Tackle team that set the high team scratch game for the SBA that is still the record and was third high in the nation that year with a 1363.

John Rougeau 2018 Meritorious Service



If you were to check Webster's Dictionary definition for the word "volunteer," I believe you would find a picture of John Rougeau. As a director and officer for over 18 years, he served on virtually every committee the SBA had to offer not to mention chairing a few of them. He took the initiative to

design, build and maintain the SBA's first website. Behind every good man there is a good woman by his side and Joyce, otherwise known as the SBA widow, graciously supported John as she helped organize, automate and develop the Yearbook in years past when John became Yearbook Chairman. Furthermore John was the main administrator of developing and

maintaining the SBA facebook page, currently with 800 plus followers. Along with his many SBA duties which were extensive, he always found the time to assist in the Women's Masters Tournament, which take place about three weekends, held in March. He may be perhaps the most influential SBA President of our time. Seven years of uncontested leadership, will give you such a good reputation. He has been able to keep the SBA's finances in the BLACK, despite decreased membership over the years, and is respected amongst his peers as he always lead by example.

Finally, the man could bowl, although I still wonder when he found the time to do so. He has had four 300 games, five 299 games, two 298 games, along with three 800 series with a high of 824. (but he is left-handed, not that there is anything wrong with that...lol)
